Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

General Information and Rules of the Show

RULES: “EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.” For specific rules, please refer to the current version of the USEF Rule Book.

USEF MEMBERSHIP: This is a US Equestrian Dressage Competition and the rider, owner, and trainer must all be US Equestrian members or pay a non-member fee (US Equestrian Show Pass \$45). Please include copies of the US Equestrian cards with your entry, they can be printed out from the US Equestrian website.

USDF MEMBERSHIP: Owners and riders MUST provide a copy of their current USDF membership cards (Participating or Group) with their entry forms. If the owner or rider is not a USDF member, they must pay the USDF non-member fee of \$35 per person.

HORSE IDENTIFICATION: The **HORSE** must have either a Horse Identification Number (HID) issued by the USDF or a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) issued by USDF. Please include a copy of the HID or LHR certificate. See USDF membership page for further membership details. If the horse also has a USEF/US Equestrian Life, Annual, or Horse Identification Number, please include a copy of this card with your entry.

AMATEUR CERTIFICATION: Riders in Adult Amateur division must be at least 21 years old and hold a current US Equestrian Amateur card. A copy of this card must be included with the entry form.

OPPORTUNITY CLASSES: Opportunity classes are offered for entry level participants to encourage participation in Federation licensed competition. Horses, riders, trainers, and coaches participating only in Opportunity classes are exempt from Federation and USDF membership and horse identification requirements, and USDF non-member/USEF show pass fees; but if the participant is a USEF and/or USDF member, they are required to list their membership number. Horses entered only in these classes must comply with the Drugs and Medications rules and are subject to drug testing. Horses entered only in these classes are exempt from the Federation + Drug & Medication fee (\$23). Horses and/or riders entered in the Opportunity classes may cross enter into the recognized classes, but if they enter the recognized classes, all applicable fees and membership requirements apply. See USEF GR 821 for the complete Rule applicable to Opportunity Classes.

GREAT AMERICAN/USDF QUALIFYING CLASSES: There is a \$15 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championship qualifier fee in addition to the entry fee for the test that the competitor wishes to have recorded as qualifying. Please see the 2021 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championship page for qualifying details.

ENTRIES: ****Credit Card Entries must use Equestrian Entries. The show itself does not accept credit cards.**

Entries must be submitted on the official entry form for this show. Photocopied entry forms (both sides) are acceptable. **Each horse and rider combination requires a separate entry form.**

The complete name and address of **the registered owner** must appear in the “owner” space. If a farm name is used as the “owner”, the farm must have an USEF farm certificate and be listed as the owner on the horse’s USDF HID or LHR certificate. A copy of the Farm/Ranch membership certificate **MUST** accompany the entry and the Farm USEF certificate number must be used as the owner USEF number.

Owner (or agent), trainer, and the rider must sign the entry form (adult signatures only) in the spaces provided and provide addresses, and telephone numbers. Don’t forget to fill in the Emergency Contact information. If the owner is the trainer, owner must sign in BOTH the owner and trainer spaces. A trainer is “any adult who has the responsibility for the care, training, custody, or performance of a horse.”

Junior exhibitor’s name, address and birth date along with the parent’s or guardian’s signature **MUST** appear in the “Minor Permission” area on the entry form for all juniors exhibiting in the show.

Total entry fees, horse/groom/tack stalls and all other applicable fees must accompany each entry by check or money order. Post-dated checks will not be accepted. Entries received without payment will not be processed until payment is received and will be subject to post entry fees if payment is postmarked after the close of entries. *** GR 845.1 requires that all horses brought onto the grounds must also have documentation of the Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino) vaccinations within six months prior to the show. All horses brought onto the grounds must have a completed entry form and be issued a number, even if they are not competing. See Non-Competing Horses below for full specifications.

CANCELLATION OR SUBSTITUTION OF ENTRIES: To encourage early entries the management agrees to refund all fees except the office fee on any horse not fit to show provided that written notice and a veterinary certificate are given to the show secretary by May 30, 2022 (4 days before the show). Cancellation of entries after this date, for any reason, forfeits all fees except those which are paid to the USEF and USDF only if the horse competes. After the show has commenced no exhibitor may withdraw horse from the show or remove them from the show grounds without the permission of the Show Management.

If the rider is unable to compete due to contracting or being exposed to COVID 19 prior to the closing date, management agrees to refund all fees, except the office fee, upon written notice (e-mail is fine) to the show secretary by midnight May 27, 2022. After the closing date, but before the show starts, riders unable to compete due to COVID 19 will receive a refund of the USEF fee, any USDF qualifying fees, and stabling fees. After the show has commenced, there is no refund.

POST ENTRIES: Entries for the Road Runner I show **must be received ON OR BEFORE the Closing Date of JULY 1, 2022** to avoid the Post Entry Fee of \$30.00 per horse. Post entries will only be accepted if there is time available to schedule the ride. Once the maximum number of rides for each session is reached, any subsequently received entries will be notified and placed on a waiting list. **Each session is limited to a certain number of rides due to the heat and sessions of this show have closed early in the past.**

PERMANENT JACKET WAIVER: Since this show is held in a climate with high average heat in the summer, **jackets will be waived for the duration of the competition.** DR 120(2). Don't forget, your shirt must have sleeves. DR 120(2.1)

NON-COMPETING HORSES: Non-competing horses are allowed on the show grounds under the following conditions: 1) a signed entry form acting as a liability release; 2) payment of either a stall or haul-in fee; 3) payment of the \$45 Office Fee; 4) proof of vaccination for Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) and 5) a non-competing horse fee of \$25.

DRUGS & MEDICATIONS FEE: Current USEF Rules regarding drugs and medications will be enforced. All horses entered in this competition must pay a Federation fee of \$23.00. This is composed of \$15 for drugs & medication research + \$8 federation fee.

REFUSAL OF ENTRIES: Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries of any exhibitor in accordance with USEF rules.

RETURNED CHECKS: All returned checks will be assessed a \$65.00 charge. The exhibitor will have 10 days from notice of the returned check to pay the debt before Show Management reports the debt to the US Equestrian and local authorities.

FEED & BEDDING: Feed and bedding is available on the show grounds at competitive prices. **Shavings may be pre-ordered on the Entry Form at \$11.00 per bag** and they will be delivered to your stall prior to your arrival. At the show, additional shavings may be ordered at the show at \$13.00 per bag delivered to your stall. NO STRAW IS ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS. Bedding must be purchased from the Fairgrounds

STABLING: Regular horse stalls & tack/grooming stalls are \$50 per day or any part of a day, or \$100 for the weekend of the show. Stalls will be available after 7:00 AM on Friday July 8, 2021 and must be vacated by midnight on Sunday July 10. The stalls are in the indoor arena building with the swamp coolers and are the new vinyl and pipe 10' x 10' temporary stalls with a door. Show management reserves the right to assign stalls in a manner to facilitate the smooth operation of the show. Please list special requests on the entry form, show management will try to accommodate them, but there is no guarantee. **Early arrival on Thursday** has a separate fee of \$140 per stall for the weekend and needs to be designated on the entry form so the Fairgrounds can be notified.

SHARPS CONTAINERS: Trainers, owners, exhibitors, or agents, you are on notice that improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments will result in fines of \$100 per occurrence. There are red sharps containers for proper disposal in the stabling area.

AWARDS: Ribbons -- First through fourth place. At least two daily prize drawings plus grand prize drawing for free stall at a future Road Runner show. Prize drawing tickets are prepared as follows: 1 ticket for each entry; 3 tickets for each perfect entry, and 1 ticket for each first place. Other prizes may be added to the drawing.

DRESSAGE CLASSES: The dressage classes will not necessarily run in the order listed, but they will run in the session they are listed under. **To accommodate the late closing date, the competitors will be notified of their ride times via e-mail no later than Wednesday July 6, 2022.** A time schedule will also be available in the Secretary's office on Friday, July 8, 2022.

ARENAS: Indoor Arena (Show): indoors; 117' x 250', footing is sand mix over natural base. Ramada arena (warm-Up): open air covered arena; 116' x 200'; footing is sand mix over natural base. Lounging is not allowed in either the show or warm-up arena. The lounging location is an arena on the north side of the barn with a sand mix over a natural base footing.

SCHOOLING: Schooling is allowed in the show arena and warm up area after the show arena is built on Friday morning up to 45 minutes prior to the start of the show. Supervised schooling will be allowed in the show arena during the Saturday afternoon siesta break beginning 1 hour after the last ride of the morning session and up to 1 hour prior to the evening session. This is to accommodate water and drag operations. The number of riders schooling at any one time will be limited for safety reasons.

JUDGES: If for any reason the judge fails to attend this show or to perform his/her duties, Show Management reserves the right to substitute a judge for the one who is officially designated in the Prize List.

LOCATION OF CLASSES: Show Management reserves the right to change the location of the classes if necessary and to modify the schedule if entries warrant.

BIKES AND MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Minors must wear safety helmets when riding bicycles per AZ State Law. Bikes and/or small motorized vehicles are NOT allowed in the paddock areas in front of the show arenas. If bikes or motorized vehicles are used improperly at the Pima County Fairgrounds, they will be confiscated until the end of the show for the protection of exhibitors and their horses.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of a licensed competition. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. **The parent(s), legal guardian(s) or**

individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

DOGS: Pima County and the Southwest Fair Commission require dogs to be on a leash at all times.

Loose dogs may be detained by Fairgrounds personnel and owners charged a fine. Owners are also expected to clean-up after dogs; supplies are provided throughout the Fairgrounds.

PARKING: Parking for trailers and other vehicles is in designated areas only. Please respect the no parking signs. Show management reserves the right to move a vehicle that is in violation of the no parking zones.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: All riders in the dressage division must wear protective headgear complying with USEF dressage rules at all times when mounted. DR120(1.1).

FARRIER: A farrier will be on call for the show and the farrier's number will be posted in the Secretary's office, in the stabling area, and placed in the competitor packets.

VETERINARIAN: There will be a veterinarian on call. The number for the veterinarian on call will be posted in the Secretary's office, in the stabling area, and placed in the competitor packets. The on-call veterinarian is: Freedom Run Equine Veterinary Service 520-261-8373.

DIRECTIONS TO PIMA COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS: Exit I-10 (Exit 275) at Houghton Road. Drive South on Houghton to Brekke Rd. At Brekke Road, turn right (west). Follow the road until you see the Pima County Fairgrounds on the left, turn left into the entrance. Follow the road to the covered arena. The show office is located inside the Indoor Arena on the south side of the building.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT: By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank and the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor, or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, Representative, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors, and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable – casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage,

or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See USEF GR 908.4

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions, and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR 222) and academy classes (academy classes are limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF Introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse breeding classes.

INDEMNITY AND NON-RESPONSIBILITY CLAUSE: All entries are accepted with the understanding that Horse Show Management LLC, Southwestern Fair Commission, Pima County, all employees, agents, and volunteers will not be held responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any horse or property at the show. Further that anyone signing the entry form assumes all risk for any injury to themselves, other persons, horses, or damage to any property and agrees to indemnify Horse Show Management LLC, Southwestern Fair Commission, Pima County, all personnel, employees, and volunteers against all loss, damages, and liability, including, but not limited to, all legal costs and attorney fees.

EQUINE VACCINATION RULE

GR 844.1 requires that horses entering the grounds at a Federation licensed competition MUST be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino pneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.

Documentation should consist of either:

A) Documentation (invoice) from the veterinarian showing the horse received the vaccinations including the name of the vaccines and the date of vaccine administration. See USEF GR 845.2; or

B) If a person other than a veterinarian administers the vaccines, documentation for this rule consists of: a copy of the receipt of the vaccine purchase that is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; the name, serial number, and expiration date of the vaccine; and the date of vaccine administration. See USEF GR 845.3.

To facilitate enforcement of this rule and easy check-in, please provide a copy of proof of flu vaccination with your entry to the show or prior to entry on the show grounds.

CAMPERS: The RV park is now open in the summer, and there are a few spaces south of the indoor arena that have power. The camper fee is \$30 per day. Please check in with the RV Office when you arrive between 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM Monday through Friday. If you arrive after those hours, please check in with Security and they will take care of the fees and paperwork.

SAFE SPORT STATEMENT: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants, who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. 2022 MISCELLANEOUS AND RULES

Road Runner Dressage Shows

Horse Show Management, LLC considers the safety, health and wellness of our Horses, Exhibitors, Staff, and Community our #1 priority in the face of these unprecedented times. We believe that between the session scheduling, ample stabling, and our scorching hot weather we can minimize the risk of contracting COVID- 19 for everyone. To best accomplish those goals the following policies and rules have been implemented:

- 1) Anyone who: 1. Exhibits COVID-19 symptoms, 2. Has tested positive for COVID -19 within the last week, or 3. Has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last week cannot enter the competition grounds.
- 2) Anyone with a temperature of 100.4° F or higher may not enter the facility.
- 3) if you are experiencing ANY of the symptoms related to the COVID 19 virus, PLEASE STAY HOME and contact your healthcare professional. For a list of symptoms, see www.cdc.gov.
- 4) Be respectful of your fellow competitors and show staff.
- 5) We will be following the local Pima County rules regarding any COVID 19 mitigations measure. We will update you prior to the show.

These rules and policies are subject to change depending upon circumstances and state/local rules. You will be notified of any changes via e-mail prior to the show.

PLEASE NOTE

- There will be no food service at the show. We will provide a list of local restaurants that are close to the fairgrounds for food.
- Water will be available and some pre-packaged snacks.
- The USEF is requiring every entry, show staff, volunteer, and official to sign a separate waiver of liability. ***For competitors this is in addition to the waiver on

the back of the entry form. Please review, get the signatures, and send it with your entry to facilitate faster check in. If you don't your entry will be considered incomplete.

- Anyone entering the show grounds must adhere to the 2022 Pima County COVID 19 policy and requirements while on the property.
- Kathleen Gale has been appointed the Road Runner Shows Safety and Compliance Director. Her role is to help guide the exhibitors and show staff to follow the new USEF guidelines to help ensure a safer environment for everyone.
